If you do things right, things fall into place!

From the Desk of Ron Osborne



When times get tough, God works in mysterious ways. We were coming to the end of the calendar year with several unknowns. Our sources of income were not what we were expecting. We lost tax revenues from the closing of bars and the decrease of tax on beverages. We were able to get some assistance from the City of Burlington to help with the loss of revenues to help treat alcoholism. End of year donations were promising with people making honorariums and memorial gifts.

Our goal for the year was to be able to replace 17 twin mattresses and foundations in the Men's Residential Program at Hall Avenue, but we made that commitment prior to the end of the year. At the end of the calendar year, assistance came in a telephone call from a donor who wanted to make a significant donation to the agency - to be used on what we needed most. Voila! We were able to purchase those mattresses and foundations for the men's Residential Program. We also had enough to purchase mattress covers and new sheets for those new mattresses. What a blessing that we received a gift from the Womack Family Charitable Foundation to make this happen.

Our wish list also included a sump pump for the basement at Trollinger Treasures to help alleviate flooding in the basement during heavy rain. The First Presbyterian Church of Burlington awarded us a grant to assist with the cost this work. Several members of that Church also gave donations and Leon Saul significantly reduced the bill for his installation services.

All of our residents in our four facilities received Christmas gifts through the generosity of donors. On Christmas morning, residents had

presents under the tree in each of our facilities. All had been purchased with thought about their needs and their wishes. All had a nice Christmas. One woman in the community volunteered to wrap nearly all the presents at our largest facility which was a huge help to the staff. Another anonymous donor donated monies to purchase fillets for the Hall Avenue residents to have at their Christmas dinner.

On January 4, 2021, we received notification from United Way that we would not be receiving ANY funds from them this year. The committee had decided that they were going to concentrate on bringing equity of all communities and our program did not fit in the mix, so we were not going to be funded. A shock to us, as we have had United Way support 43 of the last 45 years. We were told that they appreciate our fine work and our outcomes, but the Board decided to concentrate on neighborhood equity programs. We provide treatment to all in our programs, many of which come from those neighborhoods.

I often tell the men and women in treatment that if you do things right, things fall into place by the Grace of God. This Christmas season was proof that we are doing things right at RTSA, because all these things fell into place.

The United Way message was disappointing, but as our needs arise, and prayers are made, we hope to be able to encourage more gifts to meet needs and accomplish goals by the gifts we receive. Keep us in your prayers that we will be able to continue case management services for our residents, with the loss of the United Way funding.

May your new year be filled with good health and may this year be a year filled with new experiences and lots of laughter.
